High-risk areas

Various clusters have been identified in Bangkok and the surrounding areas. At this time the following have been noted as high risk areas:

- Samut Sakhon province
- City of Rayong (Amphur Rayong)
- Trio of restaurants in Pinklao area

If you have questions or concerns, please contact the Student Affairs office. Please be aware of symptoms including fever, cough, sore throat, or nasal congestion or runny nose. If you suspect you have traveled on a flight, bus, or were in close proximity to a positive case, please contact the Ministry of Public Health immediately. Travel Samut Sakhon province and Rayong city is prohibited.

Work from Home

The Office of Student Affairs and International Office is open as usual. There will be one staff member available during office hours from 09.00-16.00. Our remaining staff is available as usual via e-mail and social media accounts.

Delayed Start for the New Semester

We anticipate a delayed start for the second semester, please stay tuned to our website, Facebook page or Thammasat University for updates.

Campus policy

Masks must be worn 100% while on campus and in classrooms. Please check-in for classes prior to the start of class via the Thai Chana application. Wash hands at a regular interval.

New Year's Holiday

We recommend complying with the government's recommendation to avoid unnecessary travel outside of your province during the holidays. All travel to Samut Sakhon and Rayong is prohibited (see above). Refrain from fresh markets, crowded areas, concerts, and other locations where social distancing is not feasible.

We encourage you to monitor developments through the Ministry of Health and WHO websites. We will need your help. A few easy things we can all do include:

- Wash your hands for 20 seconds
- Use hand sanitizer
- Avoid shaking hands
- Disinfect frequently touched objects using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe
- Stay home



- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth.
- We encourage social distancing when outside of the home at all times, this includes leaving 2 meters of space between individuals.
- Local transmission is still occurring, we encourage students to avoid crowded locations, bars, and pubs at this time.
