An emerging cluster has been identified in Bangkok and surrounding provinces. At this time the following have been noted as high risk areas:

If you have questions or concerns regarding your travel, please contact the Student Affairs office. Please be aware of symptoms including fever, cough, sore throat, lack of smell/taste, nasal congestion or runny nose. If you suspect you have traveled on a flight, bus, or were in close proximity to a positive case, please contact the Ministry of Public Health. Avoid going to markets and other crowded areas at this time. Those with travel to aforementioned places please contact us. On **April 6**, a declaration form was sent to students asking about any high-risk travel activity. Please complete this immediately.
