Mock USMLE Examination

Students in medicine are eligible to take a Mock USMLE via the NBME self-assessments available on their website. After making an account, students should take an NBME self-assessment (we recommend test mode as this simulates actual testing environment. Students will be reimbursed for the cost (\$60) of the examination if the following criteria are met: The student will need to send a score receipt after completing the examination to Student Affairs prior to the deadline of March 31, 2020 at 17.00. Students must take the examination within the time from of March 19 – March 29, 2020. Receipts must be provided in full.
